Setting the Stage



Population Health Networks: Networks that work intentionally and systematically across sectors to achieve shared goals specific to improved health and wellness outcomes for an entire geographically-defined community

Population Health Integrators: Entities that have formally agreed to take leadership and accountability (alone or in concert with other network members) for specific integrative activities within a cross-sector network as a means of supporting the network's population health goals

Integrative Activities: Governance, management, and administrative activities that enable cross-sector networks to carry out tasks and strategies related to the network's population health goals
